CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I submit your Annual Report for year ended 30 June, 2023. This will be my final report as Chairman of this fine Club. They all went above and beyond because they loved our Club and did all they could to contribute to its continuing success.
